

## KUKI TOP BODIES CALL 12-HOUR TOTAL SHUTDOWN IN PROTEST AGAINST ARBITRARY ARREST OF KUKI VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS

In protest against the gross injustice meted out the Kuki people, the Kuki Inpi Manipur, apex body of Kuki Tribes, has called a 12-hour total shutdown in all Kuki-Zo inhabited hill districts with effect from 6:00 AM of July 10, 2024 till 6:00 PM in the evening.

In a statement issued on Tuesday, the Kuki Inpi stated that amidst the brutal persecution of the Kuki-Zo people by the Manipur state government, the deployment of the Central Security Forces in vulnerable areas initially provided a sense of safety and security for the Kuki-Zo people. However, the recent arrest of five Kuki-Zo individuals, in the presence of Central Security Forces, is critically alarming for the Kuki-Zo people, it said.

"While the Valley Based Militant Groups (VBIGs) are openly brandishing sophisticated arms and ammunitions in the valley, the indiscriminate terrorising of the Kuki-Zo people and subsequent arrest of five individuals is a threat that belies all hopes for safety and security for the minority Kuki-Zo people who have been fully cooperative with law enforcement efforts," said Janghaolun Haokip, Information and Publicity, Kuki Inpi Manipur.

"The ugly turn of events is deeply unfortunate and poses a significant security threat for the Kuki-Zo people. To that regard, the Kuki Inpi, in its Emergency Meeting today had resolved to call a 12-Hours (6:00 A.M. -6:00 P.M.) Total Shutdown in all Kuki-Zo dominated regions on 10/07/2024 (Wednesday) to protest against the gross injustice meted out to our people," he added.

The Kuki apex body also urged all Kuki-Zo regional organisations to strictly abide by this resolve to express solidarity for the common cause of their people - the fight against the unlawful oppression, subjugation and persecution of their people and their legitimate demand for Union Territory with Legislature for the Kuki-Zo people.

The Kuki Inpi further stated its resolute resolve to issue a clarion call to all the Kuki-Zo people to fight against



the gross injustices if the issue of this indiscriminate arrest further evolve against the common wishes and desires of the Kuki-Zo people.

The Kuki Chief Association, Manipur (KCA-M), also vehemently condemned the attack by security forces on the residence of Mr. Tonghen Haokip, Chief of L Hengjol village, Kangpokpi district on 9th July 2024.

"The arbitrary firing by the security forces, intended to completely annihilate the Chief and his family, and the damage caused to the house and properties in the attack, is irreparable," said the statement issued on Tuesday.

The security forces captured three Kuki-Zo Village Volunteers and five women, namely Kikim, Lamshi Baite, Lamshi Haokip, Hahat, and Tinnu, who came to protest the arrest of the village volunteers. They were assaulted and injured.

The Kuki Chief Association Manipur also expressed its disappointment of the indifferent attitude of the security forces towards the Kuki-Zo people. "While Meitei militants and Arambai Tenggol militias roam freely with arms in and around Imphal valley, the Kuki-Zo Village Volunteers, who defend helpless villagers and their lands from the Meitei militias' onslaught, were hunted and arrested by the security forces," it said.

The Kuki Chiefs Association further accused that the communal Chief Minister and Security Forces failed to acknowledge the self- styled Chief Commander of Arambai Tenggol, Mr. Korounganba Khuman, who was seen chanting war cries with illegal automatic rifles slung over his shoulder at Palace Gate in the heart of Imphal on November 1, 2023.

He was seen motivating his fully armed comrades to target Kuki-Zo tribals. When Imphal East police intervened at Palace Gate, the group fired at the police, overwhelmed them, and proceeded towards Imphal West in numerous vehicles. The NIA has registered a case against Mr. Khuman in connection with this incident, which is under investigation. Despite these facts, the Chief Minister and the security forces have

allowed Mr. Khuman and his militias to remain at large to this day, it alleged.

The Kuki Chiefs appealed to both the Central Security forces and the State Security forces to operate tactfully without bias, considering the intensity of the current conflict in the state. The Chiefs warned that if such atrocities, with utter disregard for Kuki Chiefs and innocent villagers by security forces continue, they would no longer remain silent spectators.

The Kuki Inpi Chandel, Kuki Inpi Tengnoupal and various Kuki civil society organisations have enforced the Total Shutdown called by the Kuki apex body in their respective jurisdictions.

# KUKI-ZO VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS CONDEMN POLICE ACTIONS, DEMAND REMOVAL OF CHECKPOINT NEAR PHAITOL VILLAGE

In a strongly worded statement, the Kuki-Zo Village Volunteers (KZVV) of Vangailhang and Tuilangkuol have condemned the incident of indiscriminate firing towards Phaitol Village by Manipur Police Commandos in the early hours today. This incident led to defensive retaliation by village volunteers.

The KZVV highlighted that the Naka Check Point of Jiribam Police near Phaitol Village has been a recurring source of conflict. Past incidents, including the disappearance and death of Mr. Seigoulen Singson, whose tormented body was found in the Jiri River, have escalated tensions. Last month, there was another incident of indiscriminate firing towards Phaitol village from the same checkpoint, prompting repeated appeals for its removal by Kuki civil society organizations (CSOs) and Phaitol villagers, which have so far gone unheeded.

An agreement had been reached between the District Authority of Tamenglong and Kuki-Zo CSOs for the deployment of both Central Security Forces and Manipur State Forces at the checkpoint. However, the KZVV claims this agreement was not implemented, leading to today's violent incident.

Following the incident, Phaitol Village underwent a combing operation, during which two youths were arrested by Central Security forces. The KZVV alleges that Meetei militants were allowed to burn houses in Phaitol village while Central Security forces turned a blind eye to their activities, even though these militants were reportedly frisking vehicles, including those of the Central Security Forces themselves.

The KZVV demands the immediate removal of the Jiribam Police Naka Check Point and the unconditional release of the two arrested villagers. They warn that failure to address these demands will result in the concerned authorities being held responsible for any further incidents arising from the perceived injustices against the Kuki-Zo minorities in Jiribam and surrounding areas.



## HUGE PROTEST AGAINST ARBITRARY ARREST OF KUKI VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS BEGINS IN KANGPOKPI: COTU DEMANDS IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Denouncing the arbitrary arrest of Kuki village Volunteers in Jiribam and Kangpokpi districts, the Kuki people began a huge protest tonight in Kanggui town against the gross injustice meted out to the Kuki people.

The protesters took to the streets and shouted slogans against the Superintendent of Police, Kangpokpi, and the central security forces for their biased attitude against the Kukis. The protest to continue till tomorrow, to be followed by Total Shutdown in all Kuki inhabited hill districts.

The Committee on Tribal Unity has strongly condemned the morning raid on L. Hengjol Village, Sadar Hills, where a combined team of CRPF units (32, 69, 86, 109, 143, GC-QAT), Assam Rifles, and state police forces arrested three Kuki individuals. The Committee asserts that these individuals are village volunteers protecting their community from ongoing attacks by valley-based radical Meitei militias.

The raid, which included an attack on the residence of the village chief, Mr. Tonghen Haokip, is seen as a direct challenge to the Kuki-Zo community's existence within the framework of constitutional democracy. The Committee on Tribal Unity has issued an ultimatum to the authorities, demanding the unconditional release of the three Kuki individuals by 5 PM this evening. They warn that failure to comply will make the authorities responsible for any resulting incidents.

Additionally, the Committee has condemned the incident



in Jiribam, where two Kuki Village Volunteers were captured while defending their village. The Committee demands the immediate and unconditional release of these individuals, who are currently in police custody.

The Committee also denounces the coordinated actions of state police and VBIGS, accusing them of burning Kuki houses and instilling fear among innocent villagers under the guise of maintaining law and order.

Despite the turmoil, the Committee appreciates the visit of high-profile politicians to the area, hoping that their firsthand accounts will be communicated to the Hon'ble Prime Minister. They urge the Prime Minister to reconsider his support for Chief Minister N. Biren Singh, who they believe has failed in administering and maintaining law and order in the state.

The Committee stresses that the situation in Manipur exemplifies the fragility of peace and the devastating consequences of nepotism, hatred, and hegemonic policies.

## ATTACK ON KUKI AREAS OF JIRIBAM CONTINUES

The Meitei militants including the radicalised Arambai Tenggol, in collusion with the Meiteis' Police Commandos continued indiscriminate attacks on the Kuki areas of Jiribam, bordering Tamenglong district.

Using sophisticated weapons and powerful bombs, the Meiteis launched attacks on Kuki villages of Sehjang, Mongbung and surrounding villages today at around 8:30 PM. The Kuki Village Volunteers retaliated and the exchange of gunfire continued till the filing of this report.

Sources said that the Central Security Forces deployed in Jiribam areas remain mute spectators to the Meiteis' onslaught.

The Meiteis' aggressive attack was also reported last night at Kuki village of L. Tangnuam, under Kangpokpi district. However, there was no report of casualties from both the warring communities.



# EXPOSING H. PREMJIT MEITEI, DIG (OPS), CRPF: THE MAN WHO ORCHESTRATED ATTACKS ON KUKI VILLAGES

In a troubling development amidst ongoing ethnic tensions in Manipur, reports emerged against DIG (Ops), CRPF, M&N Sector, H. Premjit Meitei, for orchestrating attacks on Kuki villages in Kangpokpi district. The officer entrusted with maintaining security in the region has orchestrated frequent attacks on Kuki villages in New Keithelmanbi area of Kangpokpi district.

According to reports, DIG H. Premjit Meitei acted and works as the agent of Meitei militant and extremist groups, contrary to his oath to serve the nation impartially. These allegations have surfaced against the backdrop of multiple incidents of violence targeting Kuki communities, particularly in the foothill areas of Kangpokpi district.

The accusations, if proven true, underscore a severe breach of trust and duty. They raise significant concerns about the impartiality and professionalism of security forces in the region, tasked with ensuring the safety and security of all residents.

Several incidents of his involvement amid the ongoing ethnic-cleansing pogrom against the Kukis are listed below:

- 1. Khoken Village Incident (8th & 9th June 2023): Mr. H Premjit Meitei, DIG (Ops) M&N Sector, CRPF, conducted a search operation at Khoken Village. The next day, on 9th June 2023, Meitei militants, including Arambai Tenggol and the Manipur Police Commando, attacked the village, killing four innocent civilians and injuring two others.
- 2. Inspection at M. Songtun Village for designated camp for UNLF (P): Mr. H Premjit Meitei, DIG (Ops) M&N Sector, CRPF, accompanied the UNLF (Pambei) group for an inspection of a proposed designated camp at M. Songtun Village, near Khoken Village in Kangpokpi District. However, the plan was inefficacious as the team was later stopped by Gorkha Rifles posted in the area due to his suspicious nature and security reasons.



3. L. Hengjol Village Attack (9th July 2024): In the early hours of 9th July 2024, a team of security personnel led by Mr. H Premjit, along with the Superintendent of Police, Kangpokpi, attacked L. Hengjol village. They fired around 200 bullets at the residence of the village Chief, Mr. Tonghen Haokip, destroying the house. During this inhumane attack, at least five women were directly shot by the security forces. The combined team of security forces also arrested three village volunteers during the attack. It is also noteworthy that a community school, the Common Education Centre, established by civil society organizations in the area, was targeted, creating fear and panic among the public and students of the area.

In this regard, the Kuki Inpi South West Sadar Hills (KI-SWSH) today issued a statement condemning the ghastly attack on L. Hengjol Village and the subsequent arrest of three village volunteers by a joint team of CRPF, AR, and District Police, led by Mr. H Premjit Meitei, DIG (Ops), CRPF, and Mr. Manoj Prabhakar M., Superintendent of Police, Kangpokpi, in the early hours of 9th July 2024.

"While expressing our deep anguish over the attack on innocent civilians, the KI-SWSH fully endorses the Total Shutdown called by Kuki Inpi Manipur and the Committee on Tribal Unity (CoTU)," the statement said. In light of the above facts, the Kuki Inpi South West Sadar Hills put forth the following demands:

- 1. The arrested village volunteers must be released safely and unconditionally within 24 hours of the arrest.
- 2. No search operation must be conducted in any Kukiinhabited areas.
- 3. The erring officer, Mr. H. Premjit Meitei, must be immediately terminated from his service for his

involvement in crimes against the Kukis and for siding with armed Meitei militants, including radical groups like Arambai Tenggol and Meitei Leepun.

4. All medical expenses for the treatment of the injured individuals must be borne by the erring officers.

In case of failure to comply with the abovementioned demands, the Kuki Inpi South West Sadar Hills will be compelled to take more stringent steps, and the state authorities shall be held responsible for any untoward incident that may arise, it warned.

## KUKI WOMEN ORGANISATION FOR HUMAN RIGHTS CONDEMNS MEITEIS' ATROCITIES IN JIRIBAM, ARBITRARY ARREST OF KUKI VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS

The Kuki Women Organisation for Human Rights (KWOHR) strongly condemned the act of atrocities in Phaitol village, Jiribam District, yesterday.

In the aftermath of the combing operation by the state police force and central forces, the house of Seijathang Khongsai, ex-Secretary, Kuki Inpi Jiribam-Tamenglong-Noney, was burnt down by Meitei militants, Arambai Tenggol in collusion with state police commandos.

In a statement issued on Tuesday, KWOHR said, "Seven women namely Lhaikholam Khongsai, Kimneithem Singson, Thethem Guite, Hoineikim Singson, Thoiye Singson, Lalkim Singson and Hathoikim Singson were brutally assaulted with sticks and rifle butt by the Assam Rifles personnel present there."

Two innocent Kuki village boys who were present in the village during combing operation were arrested. The two teenage boys have no connection whatsoever with any militant group, it said.

Demanding immediate release of arrested boys, the Kuki Women Organisation for Human Rights (KWOHR) stated that such wanton atrocities against women and children have no place in the civilized society and must be met with swift legal actions.

The KWOHR also strongly condemned the incident that happened early in the morning at L. Hengjol today. The security forces came to the house of Tonghen Haokip, chief of L. Hengjol, and opened indiscriminate firing, thus totally damaging the house and the household items inside.

The security forces captured three Kuki Village volunteers and five women namely Kikim, Lamshi Baite, Lamshi Haokip, Hahat and Tinnu who came out to protest the arrest of the village volunteers were assaulted and injured.

The KWOHR termed the action of state police commandos and the central security forces as "discriminatory and biased." In the name of joint combing operations, the security forces willfully committed atrocities against the Kuki-Zo women and children without any iota of respect for human rights, it stated.

"The security village volunteers are arrested wantonly while such arrests and atrocities by the security forces are unheard of when it comes to operation in the valley areas. This discriminatory act of the state police and central security forces should be condemned at the strongest terms," KWOHR added.

## KSO-GHQ WELCOMES LANDMARK SUPREME COURT RULING WHICH UPHOLDS RIGHTS OF KUKI COMMUNITY

In a landmark decision, the Supreme Court of India has delivered a significant victory for the minority Kuki community in Manipur, ruling against discriminatory practices by the state government. The case centered around an undertrial prisoner, Mr. Lunkhongam Haokip, who was denied essential medical treatment due to safety concerns allegedly based on his ethnicity.

The bench of justices JB Pardiwala and Ujjal Bhuyan, in their scathing remarks, expressed deep mistrust in the Manipur state government's handling of the case, stating, "We do not trust the state... The accused was not taken to the hospital because he is from the Kuki community. So sad!" Mr. Haokip, suffering from serious health conditions, including piles and tuberculosis, was deprived of necessary medical attention while incarcerated.

The ruling has been welcomed with profound gratitude by the Kuki Students' Organisation, General Headquarters (KSO-GHQ), which has long advocated for the rights of Kuki tribal people. They have called for further action, urging the Supreme Court to establish a commission to inspect conditions in Imphal jail and oversee the welfare of tribal inmates and Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in relief camps.

This legal victory comes amidst longstanding grievances faced by the Kuki community, including land disputes and unequal development practices favoring majority communities. Over the years, Kuki tribal lands have been forcibly appropriated as Forest Reserved or Protected Forest areas, leading to displacement and exacerbating socio-economic disparities.

The Kuki community, historically marginalized and with limited political representation, has voiced a loss of confidence in the Manipur state government, citing years of systemic discrimination and rights violations.

#### PRESS COMMUNIOUÉ

The Kuki-Zo people of Manipur, after enduring injustice and discrimination under the despotic and communal Manipur state government since May 2023, felt a ray of hope and a sense of justice on June 3, 2024, through the landmark ruling of the honorable Supreme Court of India against the Manipur state government. This ruling pertained to a case involving an undertrial prisoner from the minority Kuki community who was not taken to the hospital by the state due to safety concerns. This approach by the Supreme Court of India in support of the minority Kuki community is greatly appreciated.

The Kuki Students' Organisation, General Headquarters (KSO-GHQ) has always believed in the rule of law and expresses profound gratitude for the unbiased observation made by a bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and Ujjal Bhuyan during the hearing of a plea filed by Lunkhongam Haokip. The bench stated, "We do not trust the state... The accused was not taken to the hospital because he is from the Kuki community. So sad!" Mr. Haokip was suffering from piles and tuberculosis but was not provided hospital treatment by jail officials despite severe backache

KSO-GHQ is equally concerned about the well-being of other Kuki-Zo tribal inmates in Imphal Jail. We urge the honorable Supreme Court to form a commission to inspect and oversee the conditions of inmates in Imphal Jail and Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in relief camps for the sake of justice.

The injustice faced by Mr. Haokip is just the tip of the iceberg; Kuki-Zo tribal people have been subjected to various forms of injustice, discrimination, and rights deprivation by the Meitei-led Manipur state government for the past so many years. Our lands in the hills have been forcefully declared as Forest Reserved or Protected Forest through forged documents, leading to eventual eviction. Funds intended for the hills are deliberately diverted to develop valley districts. Developmental projects such as hospitals, sports complexes, and universities are inconveniently placed in Meitei-dominated valley districts, exacerbating land congestion issues there

The Supreme Court of India has rightly highlighted its lack of trust in the Manipur state government. However, the minority Kuki-Zo tribal community has lost confidence in the Meitei-led Manipur state government over many years. As a minority tribal community with little political voice, we have coexisted with them, enduring various injustices until May 3, 2023. Now, we are completely separated from the valley with well-defined boundaries, and reintegrating under one administration with them would be like mixing oil with water

They emphasize the need for comprehensive reforms to address these issues and ensure equitable treatment under the law.

As this ruling marks a turning point in the struggle for justice and equality in Manipur, stakeholders are hopeful that it will pave the way for broader reforms and initiatives aimed at fostering inclusivity and respect for minority rights in the region.











It is outrageous and distressing to observe that indiscriminate attacks on Kuki areas of Phaitol and other vulnerable areas continue to escalate amid the presence of a large column of the central security forces, resulting in vandalism and burning down of Kuki houses by the Meitei radicalised militia outfits.

The continuous atrocities against the Kukis amidst the presence of CAPF or the Assam Rifles has become a serious concern as it raises more questions than answers. There were shocking incidents of partiality being carried out by the so-called neutral Central Armed Police Forces in vulnerable areas.

The Assam Rifles, instead of confronting the Meiteis' aggression, launched operations against the Kuki Village Volunteers with all their might. They let the Meiteis' Meira Paibis inspect their convoys, while they did harassment to the Kuki women. The Meira Paibis also deliberately blocked the convoy of the Assam Rifles so that the Meitei militants could roam freely with sophisticated weapons in Jiribam and other parts of the state.

It is really appalling how the Indian authorities are handling this escalating tension between the two warring communities. Can the minority Kukis be safe under such a situation? Such biased action and partiality with heavy-handed tactics against the Kuki

people, particularly towards the Kuki women, is disgraceful to the uniforms of the CAPF and it demands impartial swift action for justice to prevail.

The Manipur mayhem will continue to escalate if the Centre Government remains unwilling to tackle the threat of Meitei terror groups in the State. Minority Kukis continue to face the full force of biased law enforcement agencies, be it the Central Security Forces and the Communal State Police Forces, as well as a fully-armed Meitei terrorists outfit. Has the Government of India decided that tribal Kukis have to die at the hands of fascist Meiteis?

The Assam Rifles or the Central Armed Police Forces are the last hope of the people that barely hold together the law and order situation in a volatile situation of deeply split Manipur. But, if the CAPF cannot maintain impartiality between the two warring groups, then the trust and credibility of Indian Security Forces could be gone with the wind.

Moreover, fully knowing that the Kukis are only defending the Meiteis' aggression and despite full co-operation given to them, the law enforcement

agencies still find fault on the Kukis. What will the security forces do to the Kukis if they carry out offensive stands like the Meiteis? Unsurprisingly, there were instances of the Central Security Forces sabotaging the retaliatory strike of the Kuki Village Volunteers against the Meiteis onslaught. Such is the hypocrisy maintained by the central security forces.

It is worth mentioning that the self-styled leader of the Arambai Tenggol, Korounganba Khuman, who was booked under the National Investigating Agency Act, still roams freely in the Imphal valley.

In a deeply concerning situation of Jiribam and other vulnerable areas, if the Central Armed Forces are unable to contain the Meitei militia groups, they may leave the whole of Kuki dominated territories. Let the Kuki Village Volunteers take care of themselves in the buffer zones.

On July 8, hours before the arrival of Rahul Gandhi, Leader of Opposition, Lok Sabha, in the strife-torn district of Jiribam, the Meitei armed militants renewed indiscriminate attack on a Kuki Village of Phaitol, near Jiribam, under Tousem Sub-division, Tamenglong District, prompting the Kuki Village Volunteers to retaliate in defence of their ancestral land and its people. However, the 39 Assam Rifles deployed in the area arrested two Kuki village volunteers, which is highly condemnable.

On July 9, in blatant disregard for the safety and security of the Kuki people, the combined forces of CAPF and the communal State's Police conducted an operation in a Kuki village of L. Hengjol, Kangpokpi district. They rained hundreds of live bullets towards the civilian houses, and subsequently arrested three Kuki village volunteers. Such terrorizing actions are critically alarming for the Kuki people.

While the Valley Based Militant Groups (VBIGs) are openly brandishing sophisticated arms and ammunitions in the valley, the arrest of village defenders and indiscriminate terrorising of the Kuki people is a threat that belies all hopes for safety and security for the minority Kuki people who have been fully cooperative with law enforcement efforts.

Thus, the Central security forces' bias attitude in such a conflict zone is uncalled for and is highly condemnable.

It is imperative that a political solution should be reached to ensure lasting peace. A political solution for the Kukis is necessary for normalcy to return. It is an urgent request to the concerned authorities of the Indian Union to grant Union Territory with Legislature for Kuki-Zo people.




